Snyder Village opened its doors in 1988 because of a generous benefactor, Bertha I. Snyder who died October 20, 1982. At the time of her death, she left \$2 million dollars to fulfill a need in the Metamora Community that she identified "to go toward good local medical and health services as a way to encourage more doctors to practice in the community". A portion of this gift was used to establish the medical facility at 901 Walnut which has a large plaque in the waiting room acknowledging the benefactors, Bertha, and Simeon Snyder. Another recipient of the funds was Snyder Village which opened its doors in 1988 and celebrated its 35-year anniversary last year on August 8.

Many thanks to all of you who continue to help make a difference in the mission of Snyder Village with your gifts of time and treasure.
